



In 1934, Justus Jörgensen purchased 12 Acres of land in Eltham. He made use of whatever material was at hand - from earth and stone, to reclaimed materials sourced all across Victoria. Justus and his community of artists build Montsalvat by hand in collaboration with local architects, including Alistair Knox.

With the outbreak of World War Two, Montsalvat became largely self-sufficient, with a market garden, poultry farm and small dairy. Several more buildings were hastily built for the 'farm' - the dairy, barn, stables, silos and storehouses included.
